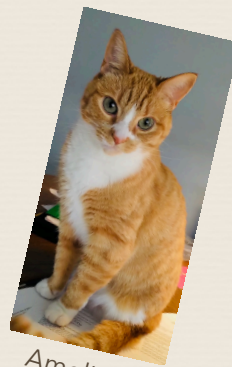




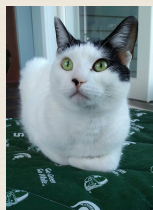

Dr. Dana Tatman-Lilly has always had a strong interest in cat medicine and behavior thus she joined the American Association of Feline Practitioners (AAFP) during her first year in veterinary school. She has been a member ever since. Her passion for cats guided her to complete an intensive yearlong Feline Medicine Distant Education Course from the University of Sydney in 2017. The course expanded her knowledge on feline diseases and enhanced her understanding of what makes dogs and cats so uniquely different. She was an inaugural member of the AAFP Certified Cat Friendly Veterinarian® (CFV) program in 2021, to expand her expertise in cat health, behavior, and welfare. Having a strong commitment to low stress handling and well-being practices in all animals, Dr. Tatman-Lilly became a Certified Fear Free® Professional in 2017 and has maintained her certification since then and moved up to Elite certification. In addition, she completed Low Stress Handling® certification in 2019. Using knowledge from these complementary courses increased understanding of animal body language, ways to minimize fear, anxiety, and stress at the veterinarian clinic, and teach others.



Services

Preventive Care For All Life Stages

Proper preventive care includes wellness exams and vaccinations, wellness blood testing, heartworm prevention, flea and tick prevention, parasite prevention and control, and health certificates (USDA/APHIS and Accredited for International travel).

Dental Care

There are times when dental care in addition to brushing is needed. Dental cleanings involve a full assessment of the teeth, periodontium, gingiva, and oral cavity during general anesthesia. Digital dental x-rays are performed to assess the degree of periodontal disease and the health of the teeth. Treatment for periodontal disease includes antibiotics, and extractions when significant disease is present.

Urgent Care

When a pet requires immediate veterinary care, an examination, diagnostic testing, and treatment are performed. For more serious conditions, the pet is stabilized prior to transfer to a nearby emergency hospital.

Advanced and Routine Surgeries

We perform advanced soft tissue and orthopedic surgeries in addition to spays, neuters, and growth removals. We take anesthesia and surgery very seriously. All of our anesthetized patients are carefully monitored throughout their procedures. Our surgical patients receive an IV catheter, IV fluids, and peri-operative pain management.

Senior Care

Our pets are living longer! Multiple age-related conditions are discussed and managed so your senior pet can live a longer, happier life.

Hospice Care

As our pets live longer, there may come a time when hospice care is needed. Our goal is to provide palliative treatment to comfort our terminally ill patients.

Behavioral Counseling

Animal behavior problems play a significant role in disrupting the human/animal bond. A physical exam and bloodwork are performed to determine if there is an underlying illness causing the behavioral problem. Counseling and behavioral modification medications may be prescribed to help manage adverse behaviors. Referral to a Veterinary Behavioral Doctor may be indicated in some cases.
